Catherine McAuley has been described as a 'woman who allowed the experiences of life to speak to her; and she listened for ministry out of this discernment. She was unrelenting in her pursuit of social justice. Blocked by the clergy of the time, Catherine was unable to continue her work for the poor unless she became a religious. As a consequence of this she founded her own congregation of Sisters of Mercy in 1831.

Many women joined Catherine working to bring about an end to chronic poverty, particularly for women who suffered ill health, lack of education or homelessness and discrimination. Together they challenged the social structures that resulted in isolation.

Driven by the words of the Gospel: 'Whatsoever you do for the least of mine, that you do unto me'. Catherine was quick to respond to any need, all with a deep faith in the Providence of God.

Arriving at the Rocks in Sydney in 1865 with two companions, Elizabeth McQuoin was immediately confronted by their desertion. After receiving the news that the newly appointed Bishop in Bathurst, to where they were heading had decided that he wanted Irish Sisters and being from England, Elizabeth and her two companions were not required. Alone and homeless at the Rocks, this one woman experienced continual rejection from the clergy of her time and the culture of society which didn't see women engage in business activities. But Elizabeth was an astute businesswoman and truly a gift to the people of Sydney in 1865. She was our daring and courageous founder whose foresight and tenacity resulted in the birth and growth of our Sydney Mercy Congregation.

After having the deeds of the St Patrick's property taken over by the Diocese, Elizabeth sought the help of a local businessman, George Whiting, to act on her behalf in purchasing the Masalou property on which she commenced Monte Sant' Angelo. A property that stands today as an oasis in the midst of the high rise which is now North Sydney. Truly an incredible gift from a woman who was stranded at The Rocks but had the ability to gather other strong women around her to begin the Work of Mercy in Sydney.
